

### Formation of GWA Bangla Group

GWA Bangla group has been formed recently as an outcome of the ToT on Gender mainstreaming in IWRM, held in Kolkata with the participants from West Bengal, India and Bangladesh. As of today this Bangla group is comprised with 27 members. Begum Shamsunnahar and Arnab Chakraborty were selected as Coordinator for Bangladesh and West Bengal and Afsana Yasmeen was selected as Moderator for Bangla Group.



An e-group was later formed with the same members on 9 December 2008 to become a virtual podium where all the participants will be able to share their ideas and thoughts, experiences and best practices, reference materials, debates, relevant links and lessons learned stories relating to gender and water in the region. This e-group is expected to remain alive through an active posting from the members from both the Bangla speaking cross section from India and Bangladesh.

Update No. 1 December, 2008

# A brief field observation of Kuntala from Borneo Island

A brief field observation on women's role and position was made by Dr. Kuntala Lahihri Dutt from her recent field visit to Sangatta, a little township in East Kalimantan, Indonesia. Kalimantan is the current name of Borneo island, part of which is under Malaysia, and another part is owned by Brunei. The largest part is in Indonesia, and is one of the most generously endowed with natural gas, oil, coal, gold and other minerals. She went to the Indonesian part, north of the large town & port Balikpapan, about 50 kms from the Equator. She was there to look at changes that have occurred in the gender roles and position of women with all the social changes that have taken place since resource exploitation began earnestly. She found that often women have been left behind at home and the economic benefits have been largely usurped by men. Men now marry more than once, often keep more mistresses than they cannot sometimes feed, they control the cash they get from logging & mining companies as compensation for their land or earn cash from jobs (those also usually go to men). However, both excess money and the lack of it can actually impact women in the communities negatively, and all the 'development' can go to men, leaving women by the wayside.

### Membership update

As of 25 December a total of three participants from GWA Bangla ToT have received membership and they are: Sukanta Sarkar, Sanjukta Chowdhury, Budhherswer Mahato. A total of 7 participants from West Bengal are in the pipe line to receive GWA membership.


Several documents have been shared within the GWA Bangla group in past few weeks. Some of the highlighted ones are shared below:
